Supplies

End blocks

Center : White print- Fat 1/8, Medium green- Fat 1/8

Star boarder: White print- Fat 1/4, Light brown- Fat 1/8,
Medium green- Fat 1/8

Center Block

Center: White print- Fat 1/8, Medium orange- Fat 1/8
Light orange- scrap 4" X 8"

Star boarder: White print- Fat 1/8, Light brown- Fat 1/8,
Medium green- Fat 1/8

Boarders

Inner boarder: 1/8 Yard plaid

Outer boarder: Scraps from the above colors

Backing-1 1/2 yard

Binding- 1/3 yard

Batting- 22" X 46"

General Instructions

~ Read all instructions completely before beginning: Measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam allowance unless otherwise indicated on pattern.

~Fusible Applique: All applique patterns are already reversed. Trace all pieces to the paper side of fusible web leaving adequate space around them for cutting. Cut around pieces. According to the manufacturer's directions, iron each pattern on the wrong side of your desired fabric, paper side up. Let cool. Cut pieces on tracing lines. Iron in place and use favorite applique method.

~Paper Piecing: Select fabric from your scrap stash or as directed in your pattern. The numbered side of paper is the back of your block. Cut all fabric pieces at least a $\frac{1}{4}$ " larger than the numbered spaces. Start at number 1. Center fabric right side up on the blank side of the paper. Holdup to light to make sure fabric covers the entire numbered space. Pin in place. Add next piece by placing fabric right sides together and turning paper over. Sew on the line between 1 & 2. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ ", press. Check to make sure all pieces cover the entire numbered space including the $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance around the block. Repeat until all numbers are covered. Trim along the cutting line.

~Quilt Instructions: Measure the finished top. Cut batting and back one - two inches larger on all sides. Lay the back, wrong side up. Place batting and top right side up centered on the back fabric. Pin or baste together and quilt using your favorite method. Bind.

~Tips: If there are very small pieces, use small sharp scissors. Use a long straight pin to help move and hold pieces in place for ironing. Don't be afraid to fussy cut your fabrics to create special effects.


Cut- 2, 5 3/4" squares, 8, 2 7/8" squares, 8, 2 1/2" squares

Light brown-

Cut- 8, 3 1/4" squares

Light green-

Cut- 8, 2 7/8" squares



Center Block

Star Center

Light orange-

Cut- 2, 2 7/8" squares, cut diagonally

White print -

Cut- 1, 3 3/8" square, 1, 5 3/4" squares, 4, 2 1/2" squares


Medium orange-

Cut- 4, 3 1/4" squares

Star boarder

White print-

Cut- 1, 5 3/4" squares, 4, 2 7/8" squares, 4, 2 1/2" squares



Light green-

Cut- 4, 3 1/4" squares

Medium green-

Cut- 4 2 7/8" squares

Boarders

Inner boarder

Plaid-

Cut- 4, 1 1/2" X WOF. Subcut, 2, 1 1/2" X 14 1/2", 2, 1 1/2" X 36 1/2"

Outer boarder


Pink, orange, brown fabrics-random

Cut- 14, 6" X 2 1/2", 6, 6 5/8" X 2 1/2"

Center Block


Half square triangles

Draw a diagonal line on a 2nd white print 2 7/8" squares. Place right sides together on a medium green 2 7/8" squares. Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of drawn line. Cut on drawn line and press. Trim to 2 1/2". = Make 3 more. Yield 8 half square triangles.




Flying geese

Draw a diagonal line on the light green 3 1/4" squares. Place one on opposite corners of 2nd white 5 3/4" square. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of line. Cut on line. Fold back triangles and press. Place a third light green 3 1/4" square on the corner opposite the triangles. Sew 1/4" on each side of the line. Fold back triangles and press. Trim to 2 1/2" X 4 1/2". Makes 4 flying geese. Repeat with white print and 2nd orange squares.




Square in Square

Sew a light orange triangle to opposite sides of the white print 3 3/8" square. Fold triangles out and press. Repeat for the other sides. Fold and press. Trim to 4 1/2".



Assemble center square using the color chart.



End Squares


Half square triangles

Draw a diagonal line on a white print $2 \frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Place right sides together on a light green $2 \frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Stitch a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on each side of drawn line. Cut on drawn line and press. Trim to $2 \frac{1}{2}$ ". = Make 7 more. Yield 16 half square triangles.




Flying geese

Draw a diagonal line on the light brown $3 \frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Place one on opposite corners of white $5 \frac{3}{4}$ " square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on each side of line. Cut on line. Fold back triangles and press. Place a third light brown $3 \frac{1}{4}$ " square on the corner opposite the triangles. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the line. Fold back triangles and press. Trim to $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " X $4 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Makes 4 flying geese. Make 1 more set of 4.




Checkerboard

Sew a 2nd white and a medium green $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " strip together lengthwise. Press seam toward darker fabric. Subcut into 8, $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " sections. Repeat with second set of strips. Sew 2 sections together making a checkerboard. Make 4. Sew the four sets of 4 together.



Assemble 2 blocks together following the chart.



Sew an end block to opposite sides of the center block.

Sew on strip on each side of the joined blocks. Press. Attach a $1\frac{1}{2}''$ X $14\frac{1}{2}''$ strip on top and bottom. Press.

Randomly sew together 2 rows of $7, 6''$ X $2\frac{1}{2}''$ end to end and attach to each side. Sew 2 sets of $3, 6\frac{5}{8}''$ X $2\frac{1}{2}''$ and sew on the top and bottom.

Note: When doing the math the numbers for the top outer boarder was rounded up to the closest $\frac{1}{8}''$ so you may have an $\frac{1}{8}''$ or so to trim off the ends after sewing.
