Table Runner

Finished Size

24" X 51"

Materials

1/8 yard or Fat Quarter Green print

1/2 yard Black print

8-12 9" scraps or Fat Quarters of Orange,
Green, Purple, Yellow, Black Halloween prints

1/4 yard Orange print

3/4 yard light weight fusible web

1/4 yard Stripe

1 5/8 yard Backing

26" X 54" Cotton Batting

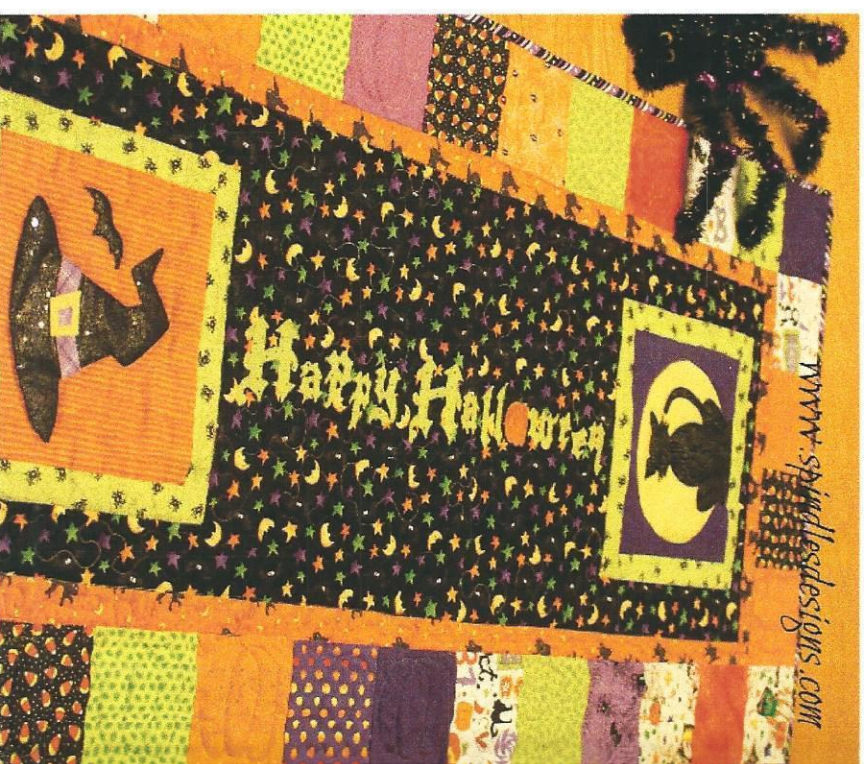


Table Runner



~ Read all instructions completely before beginning: Measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam allowance unless otherwise indicated on pattern.

~Fusible Applique: All applique patterns are already reversed. Trace all pieces to the paper side of fusible web. Cut out pieces leaving adequate space around them. According to the manufactures directions, iron each pattern on the wrong side of your desired fabric, paper side up. Let cool. Cut pieces on tracing lines. Iron in place and use favorite applique method.

~Paper Piecing: Select fabric from your scrap stash or as directed in your pattern. The numbered side of paper is the back of your block. Cut all fabric pieces at least a $\frac{1}{4}$ " larger than the numbered spaces. Start at number 1. Center fabric right side up on the blank side of the paper. Holdup to light to make sure fabric covers the entire numbered space. Pin in place. Add next piece by placing fabric right sides together and turning paper over. Sew on the line between 1 & 2. Trim fabric to $\frac{1}{4}$ ", press. Check to make sure all pieces cover the entire numbered space including the $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance around the block. Repeat until all numbers are covered. Trim along the cutting line.

~Quilt Instructions: Measure the finished top. Cut batting and back one inch larger on all sides. Lay the back, wrong side up. Place batting and top right side up centered on the back fabric. Pin or baste together and quilt using your favorite method. Bind.

~Tips: If there are very small pieces, use small sharp scissors. Use a long straight pin to help move and hold pieces in place for ironing. Don't be afraid to fussy cut your fabrics to create special effects.

Scrappy Halloween

Table Runner

Cut

Black print- center background-- 14 ½" X 42 ½"

Orange and Purple – 8 ½" X 8 ½" square from each

Green Boarder print – 4–1 ½" X 8 ½" strips, 4–1 ½" X 10 ½" strips

Orange Print – 2–1 ½" X 16 ½", 2–1 ½" X 42 ½" strips

Halloween print scraps --34–4 ½" X 4 ½" squares

Center block

Sew a 1 ½" X 8 ½" green fabric strip on each side of the Purple and orange 8 ½" X 8 ½" squares. Press seams open. Attach the 1 ½" X 10 ½" strips to the top and bottom of each partial block. Press seams open.

Follow the general instructions for fusible applique. Fuse the hat & bat onto the orange block and fuse the moon & cat on the purple block.

Cut 4--1 ½" X 8" and 4-- 1½" X 10 " strips of fusible web. Iron along the very edge of the pieced and appliqued block. Trim just to make a clean edge. Center and fuse a block about 1 ¼" from each end of cut center fabric. Using the same applique method, center the words Happy Halloween between the two appliqued blocks.

Inner boarder

Sew a 1 ½" X 42 ½" strip of orange print on each side of completed center. Press seams toward boarder. Sew a 1 ½" X 16 ½" strip orange print on each end. Press seams toward boarder.

Scrappy boarder

Make 2 side boarders by sewing 11 assorted 4 ½" squares together. Press seam all in one direction. Attach one on each side of center block. Press seams toward boarder. Make top and bottom boarder using 6--4 ½" squares in each strip. Sew one to top and bottom. Press seams toward boarder.

Follow the general instructions for quilting your table runner. Bind quilt using favorite method using stripe fabric.

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
